- No Tx

Gastroscopy




Blue Rubber Bleb Nevus

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- The GI tract is most frequently involved
- A familial history is infrequent
- They seen best by endoscopy
- Endoscopic coagulation - dangerous
- Sclerotherapy and band ligation

Case


- 88 year-old-men
- Melena

 - Diabetes mellitus
- Tx: ASA, Losartan



Bullous Pemphigoid

Bullous Pemphigoid

- Pemphigoid - bullae, ulcers of mucosa
 - Oral cavity, pharynx, esophagus, anus, conjunctiva, skin
- Potentially fatal upper GI bleeds
 - Esophageal involvement by pemphigoid
- Tx – glucocorticoids
