#### OSLO AIRPORT AND CITY TRANSPORTION/ HOTELS



#### Oslo Gardermoen Airport (OSL) 47km

Flybussekpressen AS offers direct bus service every 20min from Oslo Gardermoen airport to the Thon Hotel Ulleval Stadion (Journey time 40 min). Coupons for 50% discount on this bus can be downloaded from STEPS website.

#### Moss Airport Rygge (RYG) 65km

Train R20 serves between Rygge station and Oslo. A free shuttle bus is available between the train station and the airport terminal. The train usually departs once every hour. The Rygge-ekspressen bus service (ryggeekspressen.no) goes directly between Oslo Bus Terminal and Moss Airport Rygge (1 hour journey).

#### **Torp Sandefjord Airport (TRF) 110km**

Trains serve between Torp Sandefjord Airport and Oslo. The station is located between Stokke and Sandefjord (1 hour 45 minutes). There is a shuttle bus service between the airport and the train station, which is included in the train ticket. The *Torp Express bus service* corresponds with most international flights to/from the airport and arrive at Oslo *Bussterminal* (2 hour journey).
